




RV PARK BASIC INFORMATION

Check in is at 2 pm, check out at 12 pm. Maximum of two vehicles per site. Maximum stay of 14 nights. Fees can be paid at the pay station next to the Paddling Center building.

RESERVATIONS

Reservations are recommended in the summer months. We have walk-in sites available but can't guarantee there will be a site available without a reservation. Reservations can be made online at www.portofcolumbiacounty.org, or by calling the Port office at 503-397-2888. You may also go to the Marina/RV Park office or see the Paddling Center staff for assistance.

PARK AMENITIES

There are restrooms in the building nearest the RV Park with coin operated showers. Your pay station receipt or online confirmation will show the security codes for the restroom and Wi-Fi password. All sites have water and power, see the site map for details. Boat launch fees are included in your RV Park reservation. However, there is a moorage fee if you choose to leave your boat in the Marina overnight.

RV DUMP STATION

Automated RV dump station available onsite for a \$15 fee (accepts credit cards only).

Welcome to Scappoose Bay Marina

Scappoose Bay is a body of water off the Multnomah Channel and influenced by the Lower Columbia River. Its intricate network of sheltered creeks, tributaries and channels are protected waterways rich in wildlife that make it a perfect destination for paddling adventurers.

Located one mile upstream of the Columbia River where it enters the Multnomah Channel, Scappoose Bay offers easy access to great fishing and power boat activity. The Columbia River is the place to find returning Chinook and Coho Salmon as well as deep-swimming sturgeon.



Boat Launch

The Marine Park offers a three-lane public boat launch with access to the Columbia River and Multnomah Channel. With a generous boat ramp and ample parking for over 100 trucks and boat trailers, you'll be on the water in no time at all. The daily launch pass includes parking and is available at the pay station. Annual launch permits are available for purchase at the Scappoose Bay Paddling Center or the Port office.

Nature Walking Trail

The paved 0.7-mile loop trail is good for all skill levels and offers excellent bird watching opportunities along the river and is accessible year-round. Take a leisurely stroll, walk your dog or go for that morning jog all while exploring nature.

Kayak Dock

The Marina has a separate dock for launching kayaks, canoes and stand-up paddleboards. Check out our new kayak launch added in 2020! The Kayak Dock offers immediate access to miles of flatwater estuaries, wetlands and waterways.
