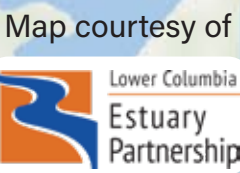
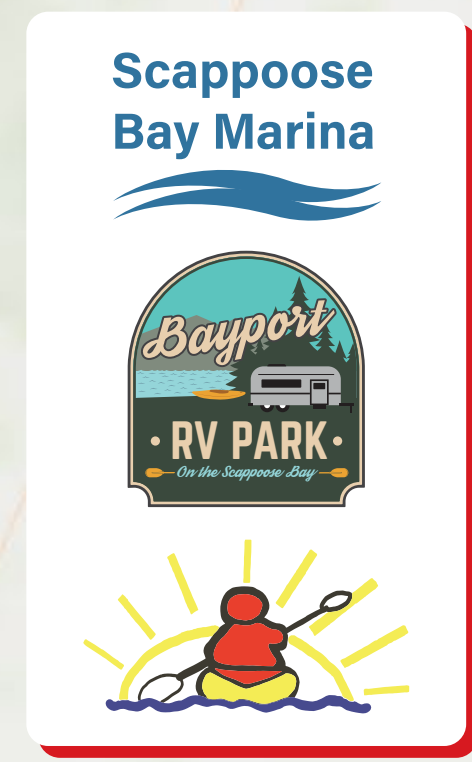


Scappoose Bay and Area Waterways

Points of Interest

- 1. Scappoose Bay**, rich in wildlife, is a protected tidal area made up of islands, sloughs, wetlands and tide channels that extends from the Multnomah channel. With miles of flatwater estuaries, it's perfect for both novice and seasoned paddlers. It's also home to Scappoose Bay Marine Park. A recreational area with 3-lane boat launch, marina, kayak paddling center, RV Park campground, nature trail and public restrooms.
- 2. The Multnomah Channel** is a 21-mile long distributary of the Willamette River that forms the western shore of Sauvie Island. It meets the Columbia River downstream at River Mile 86.5 and branches off the Willamette River upstream at River Mile 3.5 where the Willamette connects to the Columbia River. Flanked by moorages, marinas, and parks, and populated by a wide variety of fish, the channel offers many opportunities for recreation.
- 3. Warrior Rock Lighthouse** is Oregon's smallest working lighthouse. Built in 1889 at the northern tip of Sauvie Island, the exterior of the lighthouse is open to the public and can be visited by boat or a three-mile (5 km) hike from the north end of Reeder Road on Sauvie Island.
- 4. Bachelor Island** lies along the Washington shore of the Columbia River and is part of the Ridgefield National Wildlife Refuge. The northern end features one of the largest Great Blue Heron rookeries in the Pacific Northwest.
- 5. Cunningham Slough** is part of the Sauvie Island Wildlife Area and flows into Cunningham Lake approximately 6.4 km from the main-stem of the Columbia River. Managed by Oregon Department of Fish and Wildlife the area provides habitat for waterfowl and recreational opportunities for duck hunters, anglers and wildlife viewers.
- 6. The Lewis River** empties into the Columbia at Austin Point on the Washington shore. The mouth of the Lewis River is a popular fishing location. Shallow-draft boats can travel upriver as far as Woodland, Washington.
